Committees

Board Committees

The School Board may create Board committees as deemed necessary. The Board President makes all Board committee appointments unless specifically stated otherwise. Notice of Board committee meetings shall be given in the same manner as notice for special meetings, and Board committee meetings shall be open to the public. Board committees report directly to the Board.

1. Special Board Committees

Special committees may be created for a specific purpose or to investigate a special issue. A special committee shall be automatically dissolved after presenting its final report to the Board or at the Board's discretion.

2. <u>Standing Board Committees</u>

Standing committees are created for an indefinite term to fulfill a continuing District need for investigation and monitoring of a specific issue.

3. <u>Citizens Advisory Committee</u>

The Citizens Advisory Committee shall consist of 9 members. Members of the Advisory Committee shall be selected from the adult population served by the District and ex-officio members will include a teacher, Superintendent, student, and Board of Education member.

The role and purpose of the committee is to:

- 1. Provide for citizen participation in school matters;
- 2. Serve as a communication link between the school and community;
- 3. Work toward improving the welfare of children;
- 4. Gain an understanding of school goals and programs; and
- 5. Provide for a sharing of knowledge.

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Superintendent Committees

The Superintendent may create Superintendent committees as deemed necessary and makes all appointments consistent with the requirements of this policy. Superintendent committees report to the Superintendent.
