Bullying is a pattern of aggressive, intentional or deliberately hostile behavior that occurs repeatedly and over time. Bullying behaviors normally fall into three categories, physical, emotional, and verbal, and may include, but are not limited to, intimidation, assault; extortion; oral or written threats; teasing; putdowns; name-calling; threatening looks; gestures, or actions; rumors; false accusations; hazing, social isolation, and cyber-bullying.

Greenfield School District is committed to creating a safe, respectful learning environment for all students. Bullying of students occurring in the schools is strictly prohibited and will not be tolerated. School personnel at Greenfield High School receive in-service training on anti-bullying procedures.

We encourage students and parents who become aware of an act of bullying to immediately report the incident to school personnel for investigation. Any student who retaliates against another for reporting bullying will also be subject to consequences.
