Percentage of students who graduate within 4 years



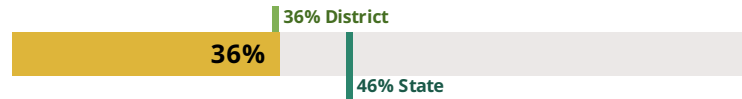
### Post-Secondary Enrollment

Percentage of students who enroll at colleges and universities



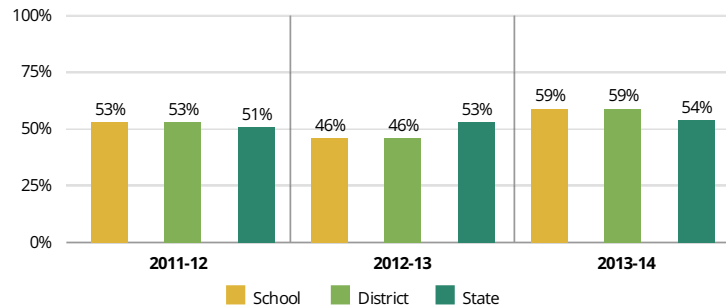
### Ready for College Coursework

## Academic Success

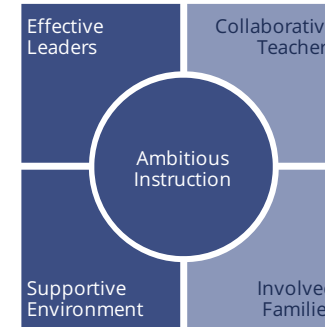

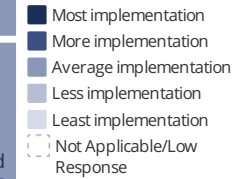

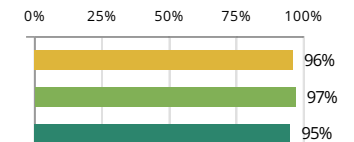

## Student Attendance and Mobility

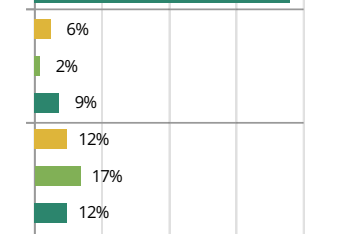
### Attendance Rate

## School Highlights

### Academic Courses

The course selection at Greenfield High School is impressive given the small, rural nature of the school. Students are required to take eight academic courses within the block schedule. The vast majority of GHS students enroll in at least one career and technical education course in addition to the core academic courses required for graduation.

### Physical Education, Health and Wellness

Physical Education and Health are requirements for graduation. All students are enrolled in physical education each year and freshmen complete a semester of health. GHS has an impressive fitness center that is utilized daily in physical education classes with machine and free weights as well as stationary bikes and tread mills.

### Other Programs and Activities

Students at GHS have an opportunity to be involved in other activities. A fall and spring musical are planned. A district wide art show displays student talent. Scholastic Bowl, NHS and Senior Gifted Olympiad provide students with an opportunity to compete academically. FFA and FCCLA are co-curricular activities.

### Career Development Courses and Programs

GHS has four career and technical education departments: Agriculture, Business/Computers, Family and Consumer Science, and Industrial Technology. Most students enroll in at least one career and technical education course each year.

### Athletics

Greenfield High School fields four boys and four girls sports teams through a co-operative agreement with Northwestern High School in Palmyra, IL. The Tigers compete within the Western Illinois Valley Conference.

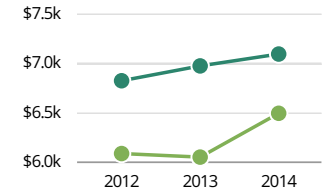

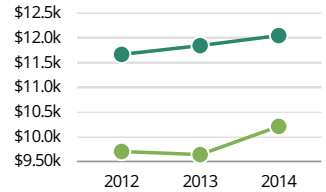
